Another Potential Scam

This particular scam may affect people with rural properties more than someone in a town area. An incident occurred recently in the Andover area where men approached a householder with available land to see if they could leave their road resurfacing vehicles on the property, pending alleged resurfacing work.

Subsequent enquiries with Hampshire County Council road repair department revealed that they knew nothing about any road resurfacing in that particular area, or of the so-called contractors. Further investigation has revealed that there is a scam in place where so-called contractors will undertake resurfacing work in small lanes and even on private property and then demand large sums of money from residents for doing so.

Genuine contractors will invariably have their vehicles and equipment sign-written with company name and contact details.

Readers are advised to treat any approaches by individuals or alleged companies who are offering this type of service with caution and only engage in any work if they feel that the individuals/companies are genuine. If in any doubt then be advised to contact relevant local Trading Standards and council offices. It may also be advisable to inform the police as well for information purposes.

Stables Break In

On Wednesday 26th August 2009 a livery yard in the Southampton area was "visited" by person(s) unknown. The barn padlock had been cut off. Fortunately, on this occasion, nothing was stolen, however earlier in the year a generator had been stolen and it may have been that the "visitors" had returned to try and steal the replacement property.

Title: BUSY TIME FOR RURAL THIEVES - Mini crime wave in Colgate

Farm Watch 1 Sept 09

This is going to be a regular update whilst the steam fair is on. Crimes from the weekend to email users only. This is too long for fax and phone members.

- A farm house was broken into in Spetisbury 29/31 Aug. A stone doorstep was used to break the glass in the rear door. The down stairs had an untidy search but the upstairs was not searched. Nothing appears stolen. A farm worker stated he did see 2 males walking away from the property along a path at the rear of the farm house (assume 31st) at 0500 hrs which may or may not be connected.
- Swyre Dorchester farm workshop broken into discovered 31 Aug. Chain saws etc stolen.
- Longburton Sherborne theft of a caravan and a quad bike from a farm 30/31 Aug. A chainsaw was also stolen. These items were from an open farm outbuilding.
- New Road Sherborne an insecure yard entered. Padlocks broken off a store and 3 chainsaws and 2 cans of fuel stolen. Property was left nearby ready for collection. It is well worth checking local woods and ditches etc even for quad bikes if you do experience a theft as items are frequently left for pick up by someone else. That way the offence of handling stolen goods is a much less penalty than the offence of burglary non dwelling. Often they just say they found them in a hedge and we cannot prove otherwise.
