FARMWATCH

Title: SECURE YOUR FERTILISER

With many farmers now looking to store ammonium nitrate fertiliser it is timely to remind you that certain extremist groups have used it in the manufacture of explosive devices. We understand that in modern farming it is unusual to have such chemicals hanging around in your yards before use or to order more than is necessary. Never the less for the time it is on your land it is potentially an easily accessible source of this chemical for terrorists. The government has a web site offering advice on the storage of this product.
www.secureyourfertiliser.gov.uk

This offers simple advice on what steps you should take to ensure the security of this chemical. If you do not have access to the web please take the time to read the following which is the most important information.

Ten Point Plan for Fertiliser Security

Do not store fertiliser where there is public access

Do not leave bags of fertiliser in the field overnight

Do not store fertiliser near to, or visible from, the public highway

Do not sell fertiliser unless the purchaser is personally known by you to be a bona-fide farmer user and is aware of the need to follow this guidance. (Be aware of the requirement to provide a copy of the detonation resistance certificate if you sell or supply relevant ammonium nitrate based fertiliser.)

Do record fertiliser deliveries and usage

Do, wherever possible, and with regard to HSE safety guidance , store fertiliser inside a locked building or compound

Do fully sheet fertiliser when stored outside and regularly check to ensure that the stack has not been tampered with.

Do carry out regular, frequent stock checks

Do report immediately any unexplained stock discrepancy or loss/theft to the police

Do record any manufacturers code numbers from the bags and if available, the number of the detonation resistance test certificate

Convicted Horse Thief Sought

POLICE are appealing for help in locating a man who failed to appear in court for the theft of five horses and a horsebox. Tony Thackaberry, aged 44, from Surrey, was found guilty of all the theft offences in his absence at Hove Crown Court on August 21st 2009, but he has not been traced since; he was found not guilty of witness intimidation. It is believed he could be in the Surrey or East Grinstead areas.

The conviction follows the theft on July 30th 2008 from a farm in Cowfold. Thackaberry broke in and stole the horsebox from the back of the yard, which was then used to transport the animals away – two of them were just three month old foals. At some point, two German Shepherd dogs were severely beaten, although Thackaberry has not been charged with any offences in relation to this. A number of chickens were also stolen. The horsebox was recovered by Surrey Fire Brigade after it was found well alight at a remote location near to Edenbridge. It had been totally destroyed and the horses have never been seen again.

PC Natalie Davies, from Steyning, investigated the thefts. She said: "It's very important that Mr Thackaberry is found so he can be sentenced for the offences for which he has been convicted. The value of the property and animals stolen that night runs into tens of thousands of pounds and the crime was obviously a distressing one for the victim.

"Sadly, the same farm was targeted again in December 2008. This time one of the dogs was attacked so severely that it died as a result of its injuries. No-one has been brought to justice for this offence and I would to take this opportunity to appeal to anyone with information to come forward.

Assorted Tack Stolen

Ringmaster Bedfordshire - Bedford - 14/09/09 Horse Watch Metal. Three incidents have taken place affecting stables in Bedfordshire.

The first took place in Cople, Bedford, between 2:30, and 3:30 in the afternoon, on the 11th of September. Offenders have climbed over a fence, and exited the same way, as they made a ladder of the victims property. The offenders have walked to the stables, and entered unbolting the door. The offenders have taken a large quantity of horse tack, including whips, bridles, head collars, lunging equipment, side reins, and approximately 3 bits. The offenders have then used a wheelbarrow to take the equipment, and have also taken a reel of wire, from part of the shed. Crime reference number JH/3,7,4,3,9,/2009.

The second took place in a farm outbuilding, in Bridle Way, Toddington, between 10:30 in the evening, on the 10th, and 11:30 in the morning, on the 11th of September. Offenders have approached, and ripped the rear door of the outbuilding, and forced their way inside, leaving scuff marks on the wall. A numbers of items of horse riding equipment have been stolen. Crime reference number JD/3,7,3,9,6,/2009.

The third incident took place in a stable yard, in Eaton Bray, Dunstable, between 6:00 in the evening, on the 10th, and 9:00 in the morning, on the 11th of September. Offenders have entered the yard, by climbing over locked gates. The offenders have then cut a padlock, off stable, and entered the stables. The offenders have taken 6 head collars, and 2 ferrets, along with their carry case, and toys. The offenders have been able to enter 4 unlocked stables, and removed 5 head collars, and lead ropes. ROAD TRAFFIC COLLISION - OPERATIONS SUPPORT DIVISION (XA) - LOG 0117 / 20.09.09

At 0052 hours on Sunday 20th September 2009, the first of numerous reports were received of a multi - vehicle Road Traffic Collision, on the A1 south, three miles south of Ferrybridge Services.

Resources from the Motorway unit attended the scene, and a full closure of the A1 southbound carriageway was implemented at Darrington. It was established that three horses had been struck and killed on a blind corner of the A1. A fourth horse was located in a nearby field, badly injured and was put down by a local vet. Five vehicles were involved in the incident, and nine people received minor injuries. Enquiries established an Equestrian Centre situated within North Yorkshire's area and about one mile from the RTC had been broken into, resulting in the horses being in the carriageway. The road remained closed for a number of hours pending recovery of the horses and damaged vehicles. Investigations into the incident are ongoing by the Motorway Unit. North Yorkshire police are conducting enquiries into the break in at the Equestrian centre.

FURTHER INFORMATION

The motorway incident was in West Yorkshires force area but the attempt break in occurred just out of our borders and was in North Yorkshire Police force area, so I only have limited information.

10 horses missing/stolen from local Equestrian Centre. Secure gates to the yard had been removed using oxyacetylene / welding type device.

4 of the horses were killed as a result. It is not known if the horses were stolen and the thieves changes their mind/encountered problems? Or if the attempt theft went wrong and the horses broke lose? Or if the horses were let out in an attempt to take equipment?

Either way, this is a despicable and very very sad chain of events leading to the sad loss of 4 horses. I have no information of the welfare/whereabouts of the other horses at this stage.

These people are going to rural areas fully equipped and intent on causing chaos to make a few quid.

PLEASE be vigilant. Protect your horses. Think about security. Security mark animals and tack. Keep a note of people and/or vehicles acting suspiciously in the area. Don't make it easy for them.
